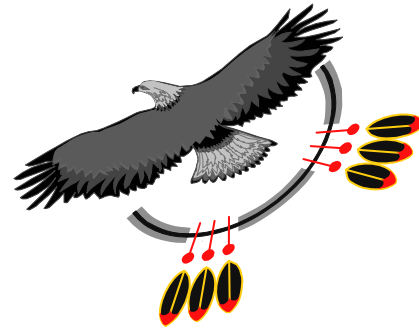

24-hour Crisis intervention services:

Some of the services include telephone counseling, crisis intervention, follow-up counseling with linkage to resources, crisis stabilization

Behavioral Health:

A complete array of behavioral health services is provided which include individual and family counseling for persons experiencing problems with mental health and/or substance abuse issues. Assessment and treatment services for intoxicated drivers, psychological and psychiatric evaluations which include the provision of Telehealth psychiatric services are available. In addition, the agency contracts for inpatient mental health services, detoxification services and residential substance abuse treatment services. All of the agency’s behavioral health services are state certified under the provisions of the administrative codes of the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services.

Community Support Program (CSP): To assist persons with chronic severe mental illness to live independently in the community with services they feel are necessary to improve their quality of life and meet their needs.

Comprehensive Community Services (CCS): This is a mental health recovery and empowerment based program for persons who need an identified service facilitator to work with the consumer and their natural support system in developing a comprehensive plan for services from community agencies to meet their mental health need.

Economic Support:

Determination of eligibility for Medical Assistance (BadgerCare Plus), FoodShare, Childcare, and Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance programs

Children & Families:

This unit receives and investigates reports of abuse and neglect and maltreatment of children between the ages of 0 and 18. Court ordered and non-court ordered services are provided to families where abuse and neglect have occurred. When appropriate, child welfare services are provided to prevent abuse or neglect or potential out-of-home placement. It has the responsibility for the recruitment and licensing of foster homes within Menominee County and coordinate out-of-home care when necessary.

Birth to Three: Support and services are available such as service coordination, family education and counseling, special instruction, communication services, nursing services, occupational therapy, physical therapy, transition planning

Family Support program: provides individual services and support to families that include a child with severe disabilities. There is a maximum limit for each child per year. The family’s income affects the amount the child is eligible for, cost sharing may be required.

Children’s Long Term Care Waiver Program (CLTC): This program provides support to children, ages birth to 22 years, with a serious to severe developmental or physical disability, including Autism, or severely emotionally disturbed

Juvenile Justice:

Reports are received from Law Enforcement of law violations committed by juveniles who have not obtained their 17th birthday. Court services are performed and services provided to these juveniles and their families as determined appropriate by the Juvenile Court.

CST (Coordinated Service Team Initiative): This initiative is a process where local agencies and service providers coordinate services in meeting the need of a child and his/her family with complex needs and who are involved with multiple agencies.

Long Term Support Programs:

Home and community based services are available to persons of all ages needing long term support services. This includes people of all ages with physical disabilities, developmental disabilities, brain injury, chronic mental illness, alcohol or other drug abuse long term care needs and persons over 65 experiencing difficulties with infirmities of aging. All participants receive case management services. Other services may include provision of information, supportive home care, alternative residential care and other supports. . Service plans are written based on eligibility and assessed need. Participant cost sharing may be involved and service or funding waiting lists may apply.

Protective Placements:

Court ordered services for people who are unable to make appropriate decisions and require the protection of society; services in the community or who need long-term placement in a nursing home or other similar facility (least restrictive environment to meet the person’s needs)

Elder Adults – at – Risk:

Reports of physical or financial abuse or neglect of individuals age 60 or older are investigated. Services may be provided to help eliminate the abuse or neglect and to keep the individual at home whenever possible.

Personal Care Program:

This program assists individuals with personal care tasks. Elderly and disabled individuals who are Medicaid eligible and require a certain level of care may qualify

Public Health:

The health unit offers a wide range of public health services focused on the control and containment of human public health hazards. The core functions of public health are to assess and monitor the health status of the entire county, develop public health policy, and assure access to quality health care.
