**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE MENOMINEE INDIAN TRIBE OF WISCONSIN:**


For the immediate preservation of public health, welfare, peace, safety and property of the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin and its community members, Emergency Tribal Ordinance 20-06 is hereby enacted pursuant to the following attachment as attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully reproduced here.

ORDINANCE 20-06  
"EMERGENCY CURFEW ORDINANCE"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE MENOMINEE INDIAN TRIBE OF WISCONSIN:

I. PURPOSE

- A. The Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin declared a State of Emergency on March 12, 2020 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Without additional measures to slow the spread of COVID-19 healthcare facilities in the Menominee and surrounding communities are at significant risk of being overwhelmed.
- B. The Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin desires to adopt policies that align and supplement those restrictions and recommendations made by Wisconsin Governor Evers Safer at Home Order. Without adopting this emergency curfew ordinance the health, safety and welfare of the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin is put at great risk for spread of COVID-19 throughout the community.
- C. Implementation of a curfew during the COVID-19 pandemic will still allow for individuals to receive essential goods and services during normal operating hours of essential businesses in the community, and will allow for the immediate preservation of public health, welfare, peace, safety and property of the Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin and its community members.

II. CURFEW

- A. To restrict the spread of the virus, a curfew is instituted between the hours of 10:00p.m. And 6:00 a.m., effective at 10:00pm on April 6, 2020 for the Menominee Indian Reservation.
- B. This restriction shall not apply to those seeking emergency medical care, law enforcement and government functions, traveling to and from work for those individuals classified as essential employees under Governor Ever's Safer at Home Order, traveling through the Reservation, other emergency travel to protect life or property, and those individuals who are fishing, spearing or turkey hunting during curfew hours.

III. ENFORCEMENT

Violations of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00 and/or up to six months incarceration.

IV. EFFECTIVE DATES

This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage and shall remain in effect for a period of sixty (60) days.
